- Photograph the windmills of Don Quixote fame along the country roads of La Mancha

- Learn about the history of Spanish bullfighting at Spain's first professional bullring, now a museum
- Tour the magnificent palace of the ancient Moors, the Alhambra, and stay on the grounds of the Alhambra at a luxurious Parador
- Spend a day visiting the spectacular wine-growing region and countryside of Barcelona
- Explore the reign of the Spanish monarchs, Isabel and Ferdinand, from Seville to Barcelona and their vast influence on the world beginning with the voyages of Columbus

ITINERARY

- Day 1.** Arrive this morning in Madrid, Spain's grand and vibrant capital where you will be greeted by your driver and Madrid host. After a short siesta at the hotel, join your tour director for a neighborhood stroll to Retiro Park and the local shops, museums, cafés and restaurants. In the evening, your Madrid host will escort you on a tapas dinner walking tour to sample different local specialties from various restaurants. (B on flight, D)
- Hotel Paseo del Prado – 3 nights**
2. Today, enjoy a panoramic guided tour of Madrid, exploring the modern city and the historical Old Quarter. Tour the ornate Royal Palace, one of Europe's most beautiful palaces, and the impressive Plaza Mayor, a vast square and stage where many historical events have occurred since the 17th century. Enjoy lunch at your leisure at one of the many outdoor cafés in this historical plaza. In the evening, dine with famed Chef Pilar LaTorre and her husband Rene at their private home. (B, D)
3. With your Madrid guide, visit one of the world's most impressive art museums, The Prado, home to masterpieces by Velasquez, Goya, and El Greco. Have the afternoon and evening at your leisure to relax, shop, dine, and explore.
4. Depart Madrid for Toledo, the well preserved medieval city that is one of Spain's artistic highlights. With its rich mix of Roman, Jewish, Moorish, and Christian heritages, the entire city has been declared a national monument. Explore the highlights of Toledo and have lunch at your leisure. Then continue on to the town of Almagro in the region of La Mancha, stopping by the windmills that Don Quixote once battled. After viewing an evening Easter procession, sleep soundly in a beautifully restored medieval monastery in the village of Almagro. (B)
- Parador de Almagro – 2 nights**
5. In the morning, explore the small town of Almagro, visiting the historical plaza with its traditional shops and medieval theater. Easter services are available throughout the day for those who wish to attend. At noon, view the colorful Easter pageant spectacle and enjoy lunch at the parador at your leisure. In the afternoon, visit the nearby town of Valdepeñas for a winery tour with wine and food tasting at a traditional Spanish bodega in this renowned wine region in the heart of Spain. (B)

6. Travel to Córdoba this morning for a guided walking tour of this ancient capital of the Roman and Moorish empires. Tour the magnificent Mezquita, the Moorish mosque turned Catholic cathedral, and the charming historical Jewish Quarter. Dine and shop at your leisure before continuing on to Seville in the afternoon. (B)
Hotel Amadeus– 2 nights
7. Explore Seville on a guided walking tour of the Cathedral, the third largest in the world and the final resting place of Christopher Columbus, the Moorish-inspired Alcazar castle, and the Barrio Santa Cruz, the ancient Jewish neighborhood. Enjoy the afternoon at your leisure shopping, dining, or taking a carriage ride. In the evening, experience flamenco, a music and dance style unique to Spain. (B)
8. This morning, travel south to visit the cliff-top town of Ronda located on the top of the spectacular Tajo Gorge. Tour the historic bullring and enjoy lunch at leisure in this charming town. Continue on to Granada, the fabled city located in the foothills of the snow-capped Sierra Nevada. Check in to the luxurious Parador de Granada with stunning views of the city of Granada. Enjoy a gourmet dinner at the parador. (B, D)
Parador de Granada – 2 nights
9. Enjoy a guided walking tour of the world-famous Alhambra, the exquisite Moorish palace surrounded by the beautiful Generalife Gardens. At your leisure in the afternoon, visit the artisan market in the city center and the Royal Chapel, final resting place of the Catholic monarchs, Isabelle and Ferdinand, before returning back to the hotel for dinner. (B, D)
10. Take a short morning flight from Granada to Barcelona, one of Europe’s most visually stunning cities. Check in at the hotel, relax, and have lunch at your leisure before embarking on a guided tour of Modernist Barcelona and Gaudí architecture. Antoni Gaudí is renowned as Spain’s most imaginative architect who designed buildings with ornate curves and gables. Enjoy dinner at your leisure at one of the highly recommended restaurants near the hotel. (B)
Hotel Condes de Barcelona – 3 nights
11. Today you will have a guided walking tour of the historical Gothic Quarter of Barcelona viewing Roman remains and Medieval buildings and the Picasso Museum, designed by Pablo Picasso himself. Stroll down La Rambla, the famed pedestrian marketplace with its colorful flower and bird markets. Shop for souvenirs and choose a restaurant to enjoy a leisurely lunch. (B)
12. You will enjoy a full day excursion to the Penedés Wine Region and Montserrat, visiting the town of Sant Sadurní d’Anoia and a famous wine cellar in the region. After a leisurely lunch, you will visit the Montserrat Monastery high in the hills above Barcelona.
13. Depart Barcelona for the return flight to Sacramento. (B)
